Subject: Recommendations for holistic development in Ghaziabad (Policy Document)

Dear Sir,

I am honored to introduce myself as the President of the Ghaziabad City Council of WICCI (Women's Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry). We are aimed to strengthen the state of Ghaziabad holistically.

We had been working on several issues in Ghaziabad as NGO since August 2020; our Ghaziabad City Council would like to propose the following recommendations based on our experience to your respected office.

1. Physical Health and Mental Health-

The awareness of government schemes 'Pradhanmantri Jan Aarogya Yojana' health insurance schemes is not present. The health awareness of such systems is essential for the smooth conduct of health well-being of marginalized and under-privileged Ghaziabad Citizens. The number of **primary health centers** must be significant in numbers to increase the physical and mental health of Ghaziabad.

2. Tree Plantations and Environmental Drive-

The awareness of Waste management is an essential practice, and we tried to execute it at the society level. The plantations must be at least 33% of the city area. Ghaziabad has hardly 2.5% of planted areas. Our city can adopt the Miyawaki method of Japan to increase the plantations at the city level. Oxygen audits can be implemented at the city level.

3. Waste Management and Environmental Awareness-

Being NGO, we are trying to increase the awareness of Waste Management at the Society level. Still, we need support from the system in enforcing the practices as essential for every Ghaziabad Citizen. The role of a municipal corporation is much appreciated, but the directives must come from the DM office to all secretaries of society to adhere to waste management practices. The collection centres must be at the society level. The waste management directives may cover solid and liquid waste management. The disposal of E-waste is also required to be enforced. It can be made part of the Policy of your office.

4. Skill Development and Special Children-

The NSDC has planned programmes for unemployed youths, but for Special children, it can also be introduced employment opportunities then the holistic development of Ghaziabad is made possible. The schemes of Ghaziabad can be made available for such an underprivileged community.

5. Orphanages Upliftment-

Our NGO made the orphanages self-reliant, and more workshops can be organized to empower them with small jobs. Such orphanages are being operational with donations, and skills can be taught to them for generating employment.

We have our City Council team comprising of women with solid knowledge and expertise in the Education Industry. I am privileged to introduce my fellow council members.
